Make It Happen!

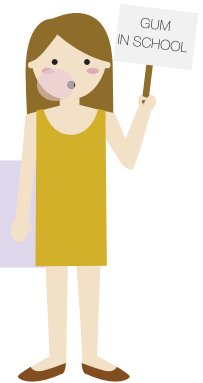
Persuasive writing tries to convince the reader to agree with an opinion or point of view.

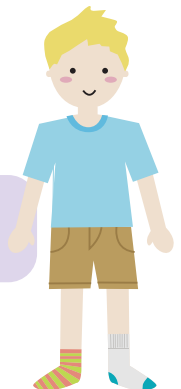

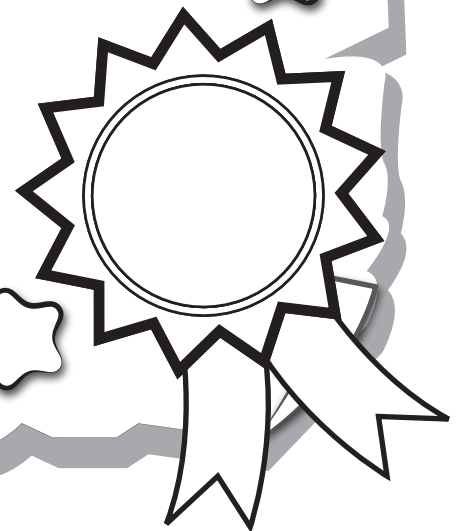
